
### **Lough Boora Parklands**

Roscrea Castle consists of a gate tower, curtain walls and two corner towers dating from the 1280s. The rooms are furnished and some house exhibitions.

Built in the early 18th century in the Queen Anne style, Damer House is an example of pre-Palladian architecture. Within the complex, there is a restored mill displaying original St. Cronan's high cross and pillar stone.

Holy Cross Abbey is one of Ireland's National Monuments. Anyone interested in ecclesiastical sites will have this at the top of their 'to visit' list. Founded in the 12th century by Donal Mor O'Brien for the Benedictine Order, but later transferred to the Cistercians, it was abandoned in the 1600s. The Abbey has been lovingly restored to its former glory as one of Ireland's finest Irish 15th century churches.

Emo Court, located in the village of Emo in County Laois is a neo-classical mansion. It was designed by the architect James Gandon in 1790 for the Earls of Portarlington and is a magnificent example of neo-classical style. During the middle of the 20th century it

was owned by the Jesuits, it was then acquired and extensively restored by Mr. Cholmeley-Harrison in the 1960s.


The house is surrounded by beautiful gardens and parkland which were first laid out in the 18th century and

contain formal lawns, a lake and woodland walks with many very fine trees and shrubs. It offers the visitor a truly tranquil experience. The house and gardens were taken into State ownership in 1994.

### A beautiful & scenic village dating to the 18th century



Mountshannon is an attractive village near the Clare shoreline of Lough Derg which offers many amenities to visitors. Activities include golfing, woodland walking, cycling, boating, fishing and swimming.

The locality has some very interesting historical sights such as Ringforts and a Wedge Tomb know locally as "The Dolmen". No visit would be complete without a trip to Holy Island one of the most famous monastic settlements in Ireland established in the 8th Century. Its many attractions include a well preserved Round Tower, the ruins of six churches and a cell like structure which is one of the most extraordinary buildings in Ireland. 

Lough Derg has 179 km of indented shoreline, stretching over 40 km from Portumna at its northern tip to Killaloe and Ballina in the south. 12 kms, at its widest point, Lough Derg is an area of great charm, natural beauty and heritage.

Many exciting activity options are available in the Lough Derg area that will inspire, relax or energise you. Spectacular countryside terrain and the wonderful waters of the lake make an ideal setting for many pursuits.



### **Angling & Watersports** Lough Derg is also an excellent angling destination with many

operators around the lake providing the necessary boats, ghillies and services. Canoeing, waterskiing, kayaking, paddle boarding and sub aqua diving are some of the high energy options that can be enjoyed if you bring your own equipment or in some cases hire locally.



Walking trails such as the East Clare Way and the Lough Derg Way allow you to spend a few days exploring the rolling hills by foot. ### Heritage

Climb the 101 steps of the 13th Century Nenagh Castle or travel back in time at The Irish Workhouse Centre in Portumna. Holy Island/Inis Cealtra in the middle of Lough Derg is a must visit to explore the heritage and history of Lough Derg.

both villages host restaurants, galleries and shops as well as a Sunday Farmers Market.

# **Poulnabrone Dolmen**

Carron, Co. Clare

### Portal Tomb that dates back to 3200 BC



The Burren's built history has left the ruins of round towers, ancient churches, high crosses, tombs, and holy wells.

On the side of the main R480 road from Corofin to Ballyvaughan, the Poulnabrone Dolmen is one such example of the Burren's built history. This ancient portal tomb dates back to the Neolithic period, 3200BC. It comprises of a tabular capstone supported by two slender portal stones, and bordered by a nearby cairn.

While it is one of over 150 dolmens in Ireland. the magnificence of this dolmen means that it is often regarded as one of Ireland's most photographed

The final resting place of some of the first farmers of the Burren, it is a mystical place to wind down after a long day, as one sits in the peaceful and scenic surroundings of this unique landscape. While there take a picture through the dolmen as the sun descends in this special place.

## A place of tranquillity and quiet



The Burren National Park is run by the National Parks and Wildlife Service for nature conservation and public access. It is approximately 1500 hectares in size. It contains many examples of all the major habitats within the Burren: limestone pavement, calcareous grassland, hazel scrub, ash/

hazel woodland. turloughs, lakes, petrifying springs, cliffs and fen.

The highest point is Knockanes (207 metres), which continues as a curving terraced ridge to Mullaghmór in the South. To the east lies an area of low lying limestone pavement, which contains a number

of semi-permanent lakes.

There are seven way-marked walking trails which vary from a 30-minute loop walk to a 3-hour walk over limestone mountains. Walking trail maps are available and each of the trails are signposted with colour-coded arrows

Looming over Clare's west coast, the magnificent Cliffs of Moher stretch for 8 kilometres and rise to 214 metres over the Atlantic Ocean. The Cliffs of Moher is home to Ireland's largest mainland seabird colony with up to 30,000 breeding pairs.

There are over 600 metres of pathways and viewing platforms along the cliff edge, which allow the visitor to enjoy a spectacular and healthy cliff walk. The amazing views of the Cliffs, the famous Aran Islands, Kerry Mountains, Galway Bay, O'Brien's Tower and the thousands of seabirds make the Cliffs a magical place. If you are lucky, you will hear and see the Cliff's Buskers playing traditional music along the Cliff pathways. Talking telescopes are dotted along the paths.



Enjoy the unspoilt beauty of Scattery Island, home to a monastic settlement founded in the early 6th century. There are the ruins of six churches and one of the highest Round Towers in Ireland, with the unusual feature of it's door at ground level. Scattery has

suffered at the hands of many invaders including the Vikings during the early 9th century but Brian Boru later recaptured the island.

The main church on the island is Teampall Naomh Mhuire There is

an effigy of a bishop's head on the outside of the east window of the Cathedral believed to be that of St. Senan. An exhibition of the history of the island is housed in the visitor reception building, which is situated near the pier.







# **Experience Medieval Limerick**



The King's Island Medieval Quarter of Limerick City contains a wealth of built heritage.

Nicholas Street, the city's old main street links most of the sights—Bishop's Palace, now home to Limerick Civic Trust and open to the public; King John's Castle and some of the remains of the Walls of Limerick.

Limerick is often referred to as the Treaty City and across the bridge from the castle is the famous Treaty Stone upon which folklore says the 1691 Treaty was signed. Limerick City Museum is currently situated in City Hall.

Also on Nicholas Street are the old Alms Houses and the remains of the City Exchange, which used to be the central hub of commercial activity in Limerick, and now forms one of the boundary walls of St Mary's Cathedral.

King John's Castle was built between 1200 and 1210 and was repaired and extended many times over the following centuries, most recently in 2013. It remains a most impressive Anglo-Norman Fortification.

Walking tours of both King's Island and other historic elements of the city are available. Enquire at the Tourist Office.







Foynes is a Discovery Point on the Wild Atlantic Way and is part of the N69 Coastal Driving route (Limerick to Kerry). This busy seaport was Ireland's first transatlantic airport from 1939-1947. Foynes was where the first transatlantic

passenger flights from the United States arrived in 1939, and it was in Fovnes in 1943 that Chef Joe Sheridan invented the world's most famous drink "Irish Coffee".

The Foynes Flying Boat & Maritime Museum, situated in the original airport terminal building.

# **Desmond Hall**

**Newcastle West. Co. Limerick** 

## Step back in time



This is a unique heritage attraction located in the centre of Newcastle West-a Co.Limerick town located on the N21 between Limerick City and Killarney, Co.Kerry. Desmond Hall was built by the Fitzgeralds (Earl of Desmond) in the 1200's.

It is an imposing two-storey structure and was used by the Earls of Desmond for banqueting and entertainment. It has a fascinating history; having survived battes, sieges and rebellions.

The hall, vaulted lower chamber

and adjoining tower were all constructed during the 15th century (the hall and chamber were built on the remains of a 13th century structure of similar size). Its restored medieval features include an oak musicians' gallery and a limestone hooded fireplace.
